Procedure

① Fill out application form on the Internet & pay application fee. \rightarrow ② Print out the completed application form. \rightarrow ③ Submit the printed application form with other required documents. (e.g., certificate of graduation, transcript, and study plan) to the GS TESOL Office in person or by mail within the designated period and confirm your submission through a phone call or email). \rightarrow ④ Check the date, time and venue of the interview. \rightarrow ⑤ Interview \rightarrow ⑥ Check the list of successful applicants.

03. Qualifications

- $A.\,An\,undergraduate\,degree\,or\,above\,from\,an\,accredited\,4-year\,domestic\,or\,overseas\,university$
- (% Those who are expected to graduate by August 2024 are also eligible to apply.)
- B. Students who have earned credits through self-educated or academic credit bank systems are also eligible to apply to the M.A. program only if they hold a bachelor's degree from one of Korea's accredited institutes by the time of application
- C. International students should also apply through the online application process, and there are no special requirements for international students.

04.Admission Selection

Process

A. Document evaluation

* Preference is given to those who have a TESOL-related diploma or certificate.

B. Interview (Attendance is mandatory.)

- ** Applicants who are recommended not to attend a face-to-face interview (see below) can request a video interview (remote interview) by contacting the GS TESOL Office when submitting application documents.
- * Applicants who are recommended not to attend face-to-face interview
 - * Applicants who are waiting the result of diagnostic testing from COVID-19 Screening Clinics or are conducting the self-isolation notified by community health center within 7 days before the interview are not allowed to take the interview. In this case, you have to report it to GS TESOL Office(tesolgs@hufs.ac.kr).

05.Required Documents

- A. Application form (Complete the form online and print it out.)
- B. Study Plan (Download the form from http://tesolgs.hufs.ac.kr.)
- C. 1 copy of diploma (or proof of prospective graduation) and an official transcript
- ** Academic-related documents issued by an overseas institution should be authenticated by an Apostille or consulate.

※ Regarding Apostille

An Apostille is a certification that authentificates documents. Under the Hague Convention, member states have agreed to recognize public documents issued by other signatory countries if those public documents are authenticated by the attachment of an internationally recognized form of authentication known as an Apostille. If candidates are not from the signatory states, they instead need to submit academic documents authenticated with consular legalization stamps.

06.Supplement Credits Track

 $\hbox{A. Students may choose this track as a substitute for Thesis or Portfolio Track.}$

B. Freshmen who were admitted from spring 2021 and thereafter may apply for this track.

07. Benefits

Credits can be transferred to GS TESOL from an appropriately earned degree or certificate (if applicable) as follows:

- A. 4 major credits and 3 prerequisite courses for a TESOL certificate awarded by the HUFS TESOL Professional Education Center (HUFS TPEC)
- B. A maximum of 3 prerequisite courses may be credited for a TESOL certificate awarded by institutions other than HUFS TPEC. (There is an evaluation procedure after admission.)
- C. 3 prerequisite courses for a bachelor's degree in an English-related major, double major, or minor
- $\,$ D. 3 prerequisite courses for a master's degree in an English-related major
- E. 6 credits for a master's degree in a TESOL-related major
- F. 8 credits for a master's degree in TESOL
- X TESOL degree holders may also be exempt from one semester of registration.

08. Scholarship

- A. Merit Scholarship of Entrance Exam
- Students who achieve a high score on their entrance exam may be eligible for a merit scholarship.
- B. Merit Scholarship of Outstanding Academic Performance
- Students who achieve a high GPA in their previous semester at GS TESOL may be eligible for a merit scholarship.
- C. Scholarship for GS TESOL Student Council
- D. Scholarship for assistant at GS TESOL Office

09.Study Abroad Program

What	5 TESOL at HUFS offers students the opportunity to study at the University of awaii (UH), one of the most prestigious universities in the field of linguistics in the nited States. Students study one out of four semesters at UH, and the credits irned are recognized by HUFS for graduation.			
How	Credits earned at UH can be transferred to HUFS. During the semester of study at UH, students pay UH tuition fees but not GS TESOL HUFS tuition fees.

10. Internship Program

A. GS TESOL students can participate in the overseas internship programs offered by the TESOL Professional Education Center at HUFS.

- B. Overseas Internship Programs
- Internship at California State University (San Bernardino): Students can take part in the internship programs at California State University, which run for four weeks.
- Internship at Selkirk College (Canada): Students can participate in the internship programs at Selkirk College (Canada), which run for four weeks.

11. Dual Degree Program

What	GS TESOL at HUFS has a Dual Degree program with Temple University, a top-ranked research university in Philadelphia, United States. Students study three to four semesters at HUFS, and study two semesters in Temple University to earn MA in both universities.
How	Credits earned at Temple can be transferred to HUFS and vice versa. During the semesters of study at Temple, students pay the tuition fees of Temple University but not GS TESOL HUFS tuition fees.
Application Eligibility	 Those who are in their first semester or second semester for students who are subject to pre-requisite classes. Those who achieve a total score of 90 or higher on the iBT TOEFL. (The minimum iBT TOEFL score is subject to change.)

12. Other

A. Application Fees: 80,000 won (Application Fee) + 5,000 won (Online Transaction Fee)

- B. Off-line applications should be submitted by registered mail or in person and are valid only if the application is submitted by 5 pm on the final day of applications.
- C. After passing all the Admission Selection Process, candidates who need to obtain a Student VISA (D-2) may request a "Certificate of Admission."
- D. Matriculation may be rescinded under the following conditions:
- In case an applicant is discovered to have applied through illegal means such as submission of false/forged materials;
- In case any required documents are omitted.

- E. Applicants are required to provide correct contact information (postal addresses, phone numbers, fax numbers, e-mail addresses) of the schools that they have attended. Verification of academic records will be conducted on the basis of such contact information. If any submitted documents contain false or inaccurate information, this may have a negative bearing on the application.
- F. Original documents should be submitted in principle. (Those who provide copies of required documents are then required to submit original documents at a later date after gaining admission and registration.)
- G. Original documents will not be returned to the applicants who do not register during the registration periods.
- H. Applicants may be required to submit additional documents, aside from the required ones mentioned above, for the purpose of verification of school records.
- I. Applicants with foreign nationalities may be required to pay tuition fee 60 days in advance of the 1st day of classes.

Tuition Policy

W Upon announcement of successful applicants, it is required for the admitted students to pay a deposit of 500,000 won within a week of the announcement. The remaining tuition fee must be remitted by the payment dates informed later.
